IT CAN ACHIEVE

Since 'Industrial Revolution' industrialization is regarded essential for rapid development of the country. The countries which solely relied on agriculture lagged financially and remained economically underdeveloped, whereas the nations which gave weight to rapid development to industry achieved high rates of economic development. Pakistan is no exception here as struggling industrial sector is also affecting the pace of economic progress in Pakistan.

Pakistan's technical and vocational education and training (TVET) system is confronted with numerous challenges in areas of access, quality and relevance. It is evident that quality and relevance of the training is not up to the mark and there can be seen a gap between availability of skilled labour and requirements of the industrial sectors. There is a strong need to creating more awareness and giving the Pakistani youth including men and women a sense that skill development is the key to get out of poverty trap. In this respect, a well-planned strategy to revitalize TVET sector will lead to an improved system with positive outcomes for trainees and ultimately will help raise the prestige of skills development.

TVET plays a very crucial role in economic consolidation of Pakistan. However, there is a gap in TVET sector in Pakistan that needs to be filled by smart strategy. First, by promoting demand and making the supply of courses more demand oriented. Secondly, by improving involvement of private sector in technical and vocational trainings setups. Thirdly, there is a need for critical assistance to enhance capacities of technical and vocational training institutes to increase the process of skilled workforce development in our industry. The institutes must be equipped with the latest training equipment and modernized workshops to meet the contemporary standards. Fourthly, one of the most important features of TVET is its orientation towards the wage/self-employment. There should be strong market linkages among TVET pass outs, Micro Finance Institutes (MFIs) and job placement agencies. The provincial governments must coordinate with federal initiatives to catalyse the reformation of TVET sector in Pakistan. Undoubtedly, robust economic growth is a natural result of viable industrial sector substantiated with adequately skilled labour.

In collaboration with the European Union (EU)-Delegation to Pakistan, Technology Upgradation and Skill Development Company (TUSDEC) is implementing a four and a half year programme seeking sustainable upgradation in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) sector in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA). The project aimed to improve the involvement of the private sector in Technical and Vocational Training in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) and Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) by promoting demand and making the supply of courses more demand oriented.

The project is catering entire community of KP and FATA, especially the rural communities which include women and young men (15-35 years). The project is also focusing IDPs & people with disabilities for their skill enhancement. Under this project, 12,000 trainees with at least 10% of women will be trained in multiple demand driven trades.

TRAININGS AT A GLANCE



Terrorism has long been hitting KP and FATA regions of Pakistan. The conflict situation has largely affected the fabrication of social life of the natives of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa & Federally Administered Tribal Areas (FATA). However, traumatic situation in FATA is unprecedented. The people of FATA, due to war on terror, are reported to be faced with serious social, psychological and economic problems. There was never such a higher desire by development sector to initiate such projects in KP & FATA which could help local people to overcome their problems, particularly economic. Therefore, TUSDEC in association with EU took a leap forward to support the local population of KP & FATA to mitigate their problems, resulting due to their financial constraints.

TUSDEC joined hands with the Delegation of European Union to Pakistan to implement a four and a half year TVET support programme in areas of KP and FATA. The Project "SUPPORTING TVET SECTOR IN KHYBER PAKHTUNKHWA AND FEDERALLY ADMINISTERED TRIBAL AREAS" focuses at improving the participation of private sector employers based at the target geographical areas in order to ensure quality and demand driven TVET trainings. The project also impels curricula standardization of the TVET institutes in KP and FATA keeping in view the training requirements of the local industries. The action encompasses regional trade bodies, TVET institutes, Technical Education Boards, NAVTTC and FATA Development Authority as its key stakeholders. The core purpose is to effectuate technical and vocational education in KP and FATA to move from a supply-driven to a demand-driven training mechanism. The project deliberates to train 12000 men and women of KP and FATA in various technical and vocational trades thereby increasing their chances towards employment.

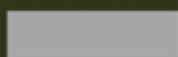

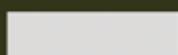

SUCCESS

An Effort for Bringing KP & FATA Youth in Mainstream Economy

Breaking with the past and putting KP & FATA with sustainable development through education and training to youth leading towards better livelihood was the objective of TUSDEC EU-TVET Programme. The programme is organizing trainings to achieve its objective as young graduates proved their capabilities in utilizing the skills while earning for life.

Story from Balakot:

A 20 years old handicapped Sanaullah belongs to the earth quake hit area, Balakot. He passed his matriculation examination but unable to continue his studies due to poverty. However, after some time he got to know about the free technical course offered by TUSDEC EU TVET Support Programme in Skill Development Center, Balakot, which became a ray of hope for him. After completion of his training course, he got interest free micro finance loan from AKHUWAT, a micro finance institute with support of TUSDEC. He bought tools required for False Ceiling work and started working as a Freelancer.



"I felt helpless, I thought I will never be able to fulfill my dream of getting education and to achieve a respectable status in society because of our financial constraints. I was completely hopeless and unemployed. After some time I got to know about the free technical course offered by TUSDEC EU TVET Support Programme in Skill Development Center, Balakot, which became a ray of hope for me as I am the only one son of my parents having three sisters. My father was a labor and was unable to fulfill our financial needs. So I started my journey by getting admission in the False Ceiling trade. It was market oriented and demand driven, as due to earth quake here the construction work is done at large scale".

Story from Lakki Marwat

Zaheer Ud Din, a young guy from Lakki Marwat was ambitious and wanted to get higher education but after his father demise, he was unable to fulfill dreams. He was a laborer and dropped out from his school after passing his eighth class examination. After leaving his education he started apprenticeship in a local welding shop with a skilled person. In the mean time he got to known about the free technical course offered by TUSDEC EU/TVET Programme in Niazi Polytechnic Institute, Lakki Marwat. He applied for admission and fortunately got one in the welding trade. So he learned the welding related skills in systematic way as there was theory and practical classes. After completion of training, he got interest free micro finance from AKHUWAT- MFI. Furthermore, with 40,000 startup capital he started his small level business.



After leaving his education he started apprenticeship in a local welding shop with a skilled person. He used to earn 200 Rs per day but he was unable to support his family.

Vocational training mechanism in KP, Fata reviewed

RECORDING REPORT

LAHORE Technology Upgradation and Skill Development Company (TUSDEC) has organized "Programme Stakeholders Group Meeting" to discuss and nail down the results and findings of a baseline study reflecting the rundown of technical and vocational education in various districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and FATA.

According to the company's spokesperson, the baseline study was conducted to efface the four years programme, sponsored by European Union, to uplift the socio-economic status of rural/marginalized communities through improving the quality and access of technical and vocational education for them. An exhaustive market research has been performed to trace the labor market trends while attributing the prevalent standards and provisions of TVET

(Technical Education and Vocational Training) sector in the inland provincial territories.

The spokesperson further said that the study has uncovered the very blue-chip which will further steer the successful implementation of a market demand-driven training mechanism and the capacity building of TVET institutes as the adjacent phases of the program.

To support the comprehension and sustainability of the program, TUSDEC has aligned all the competent authorities, relevant to the project scope, thus formulating a full-scale stakeholders group.

While highlighting few of the key findings of the research, the company spokesperson said that trades related to construction and gemmology have found to be in greater demand by the local industry in KP and FATA while 31 TVET institutes have been identified for their capacity

building to host the final 15 trades asserted the baseline study.

However, the study reflected the higher level of state-owned TVET in comparison to the private training centres in administrative market relevant vocational trainings.

The study has also disclosed that only 8 percent of the target population receive formal technical or vocational training while the rest is considered formulaic Ustad-Shishya system. The meagre link with the industry directs the supply-driven approach of TVET sector in KP and FATA, which the trained manpower is not graciously absorbed by labor market.

The study has also brought forward various trades that be fostered for the vocational trainings of culturally-restricted women of the areas.

Technology Upgradation and Skill Development Company (TUSDEC) has organized "Programme Stakeholders Group Meeting" to discuss and nail down the results and findings of a baseline study reflecting the rundown of technical and vocational education in various districts of KP and FATA.

Addressing the same lie, a round table of project's stakeholders has been organized at Peshawar to share the research findings and finalize them with the feedback from concerned parties.

While sharing few of the key findings of the research, the company spokesperson said that trades related to construction and gemmology have found to be in greater demand by the local industry in KP and FATA while 31 TVET institutes have been identified for their capacity

However, the study has reflected the higher level of state-owned TVET in comparison to the private training centres in administrative market relevant vocational trainings.

The study has also disclosed that only 8 percent of the target population receive formal technical or vocational training while the rest is considered formulaic Ustad-Shishya system.

The meagre link with the industry directs the supply-driven approach of TVET sector in KP and FATA, which the trained manpower is not graciously absorbed by labor market.

The study has also brought forward various trades that be fostered for the vocational trainings of culturally-restricted women of the areas.
